Blandine, a mother of two, moved into Hope Homes, the newest development in CHN's flagship Lease Purchase program, in 2025.

For her, joining this community has brought both stability and joy for her growing family. After recently welcoming a newborn, she shared how the transition into her new home has been smooth and supportive, thanks in part to CHN staff and the welcoming neighborhood.

The spacious, affordable home has given her children room to play, while its location close to work, school, and church has made daily life easier.

She described the simple moments that make the house feel like home, including sitting on the porch watching neighborhood kids play, greeting neighbors, and even discovering a nearby neighbor who shares her roots in the Congo. Through CHN's Hope Homes and the Lease Purchase Program, her family is not only gaining a safe and stable place to live today, but also a clear path toward homeownership and a brighter future.

Homeownership

CHN helped hundreds of families move toward stable homeownership through our flexible Believe Mortgage lending products, Lease Purchase homes, and down payment assistance in both Ohio and Michigan. Our programs provide affordable financing, financial education, and long-term support so families build equity and stability.

Stable & Affordable Housing

In 2025, CHN added hundreds of affordable homes while providing safe, affordable rental housing to more than 2,500 households across Cleveland and Detroit. Our work ensures residents have stable homes while we also build new developments, expanding housing opportunities for veterans, families, and seniors.

270 LIHTC units closed financially
2,500 units owned/managed in Cleveland, Pittsburgh and Detroit

Home Repair & Conservation

Through our home repair, energy conservation and water bill assistance programs, CHN helped thousands of families stay safe, warm, and financially secure in their homes. Our Single Family Preservation and Energy Services programs lowered utility costs, prevented displacement, and preserved housing in Cleveland and Detroit neighborhoods.



1,446 home repair projects completed
4,450 weatherization and energy conservation projects completed
1,159 clients assisted with water bills

Family Success & Supports

CHN's Family Success and Financial Mobility programs helped thousands of households improve financial stability through housing counseling, tax preparation, and one-on-one coaching. These services support long-term housing stability and economic mobility and help families thrive.

76 youth residents engaged in summer employment and apprenticeships

Housing Policy & Solutions

CHN focuses on educating and engaging stakeholders at the federal, state and local level about the importance of housing stability and homeownership. We provide practitioner-based policy recommendations for their consideration and, where appropriate, implement these solutions. One of those solutions is the Detroit Housing Network, which convenes community development organizations to create a single front door for housing services.
